

This is the basis of any trip, but especially a road trip. Start your trip at a hub location, and plan a trip that has a trajectory that makes sense to you.


My purpose of this trip was to visit national parks. So every stop I added along the way had to include a national park and ultimately had to lead me back to final destination, Vegas.

Don't forget to head to a supermarket to purchase all of your snacks and breakfast items for the road.

Things to do in Vegas

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Vegas focuses on a few things: gambling, partying, entertainment, and shopping. So spend your time doing those things at your convenience. Walking the strip was my favorite part because I felt like I could see everything.

Bring good walking shoes and be prepared to get those steps in. While walking the strip you can get 32oz margarita drinks from just about anywhere. Never wait in a long line for them. I went to the restaurant Wabo Cabo and paid \$20 for mine. Definitely overpriced but that is Vegas for you. You can explore Vegas in 36 hours and never have to go again.

Bellagio Bonatical Gardens

The botanical gardens are located inside the Bellagio Hotel. The gardens are small so plan to spend no more than 15 minutes here.

This is a popular spot for families to bring their children.



Zion National Park

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First stop. Zion National Park is located in Springdale, Utah. It is known for it's steep red cliffs. Zion is an absolute treasure.

Expect long lines to enter the park. This is a frequently visited attraction. Purchase your annual National Parks Pass here upon arrival. \$80 and can be used to enter in any federal national park for one year. Parking is free inside the park.




Zion National Park

Zion National Park Accommodations

I stayed in this hotel, which was more like a motel, located in La Verkin, Utah. 30 minutes away from Zion Park.

The owner was very nice and helped me with my car. Good place to stay for the night. \$90 per night.



Food

After hiking and working up an appetite, head to Stage Coach Grille.

The steakhouse is located directly across the street from Hotel Zion Inn in La Verkin, Utah.

Expect to pay about \$30-\$35 for a meal.

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Horseshoe Bend

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Horseshoe Bend is a horseshoe-shaped incised meander of the Colorado River located near Page, Arizona. It is located inside Glen Canyon. Hiking to horseshoe bend is more like a stroll and would be rated very easy. Parking is \$10.

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Hanging Garden Trail

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Since it won't take long to explore Horseshoe Bend, you can also head to the Hanging Garden Trail. which is about 5 minutes away. This is another very easy hike with gorgeous views. Free parking and free entry.

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You can go to the top of the rocks, like the ones pictured here if there is a path marked out for you. There will be stones placed in a row to let you know if it is marked out for you.



Best Western of Lake Powell

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The Best Western of Lake Powell Hotel is located close to Glen Canyon. You have the option of choosing a room with a view of the mountains. They also provide a small breakfast that includes a muffin, fruit, granola bar, and water.

This was the best hotel on the trip because it was an actual hotel. As you road trip throughout the United States you will see establishments advertised as hotels but are really motels. Since the Best Western is a chain, you probably have more idea of what to expect.

Lastly, the hotel provides you with a list of marinas and other canyons to check out in the area and the staff are friendly. I would stay here again. \$70-\$80 per night.

Food

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There are tons of restaurants located near Lake Powell. I enjoyed <u>El Tapatio</u> which is a Mexican restaurant. The prices were reasonable and the portions were large. I paid \$39.00 for an appetizer, entree, and 1 alcoholic beverage.



Grand Canyon

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The Grand Canyon is a natural formation of red rocks located in Arizona. It is breathtaking and a must visit. No pictures could ever do it justice. During COVID-19 visitors have to visit through the South Entrance located in Tusayan, Arizona. In order to really enjoy the Grand Canyon you'll have to spread your trip out over at least two days.

That way you will not feel rushed and can explore at your own pace. The Grand Canyon is included in your National Parks pass so entry & parking are free.

Bring snacks and water for your visit. You're going to need it especially for day 2.


The hiking is strenuous. You will be extremely tired and sore but that makes for a great adventure. You can always go at your own pace no matter which trail you take.

Lastly, plan to arrive early between 9:00am-10:00am. Expect long lines to enter the park.

Day 1- I recommend you explore Mather Point View Day 2 - Desert View (Hiking)



Accommodations

Hotel Aspen Flagstaff

You may want to consider staying at a bed & breakfast or paying the extra money for a hotel closer to the Grand Canyon. Flagstaff is the closest city, but a 90 minute drive away from the Grand Canyon. After a day at the Grand Canyon can be exhausting.


If I could do the trip again, I would have paid extra to stay closer to the Grand Canyon.

I stayed at Hotel Aspen Flagstaff which was more like a motel. It is located just off of Route 66.

The accommodation was basic and they provided free coffee in the room. I would not stay in the hotel again. \$80 per night.

Food

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Rad trip food is mainly fast food. Along Route 66 you can find just about every fast food restaurant you can think of.


However, downtown Flagstaff has solid food places that you may want to consider as an alternative to fast food or if you are not able to cook your own food.

You can simply do a google search of "Food near me" to find a wide variety of restaurants.

I had an average ramen dinner from Sosoba's Ramen that I wouldn't have again. There are tons of restaurants though so read reviews and take your pick!

Food Martanne's

Martanne's is a well known Mexican restaurant in Flagstaff. Tons of travelers were in and out. I waited 15 minutes for a table and the service was extremely quick. Careful you may be a little gassy after your meal! Total was \$20 with tip and drink included.



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Hoover Dam

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As you end your trip and make your way back to Vegas, I recommend stopping at the Hoover Dam. During COVID-19 all tours have been cancelled so you cannot go down into the turbines. I think it's still worth a visit.


You're still able to learn a lot about American History, the folks that died creating the Hoover Dam and the history behind the structure.

Parking is technically free but most people park in the garages which are \$10.

Note: There is a security check-point before you enter the Dam. You are required to roll down all of your windows so security can see inside. Guns are not allowed in the Dam.
